Church Live Stream – is now operational. All Masses are available to be viewed live online on www.straideparish.com.

The Sick & Housebound – will be visited (if they wish) on Thursday, July 2^{nd} . Fr. Martin will be in touch, in advance, with all those on his visitation list to see if they would like the monthly Communion Call to be restored.

New Offertory Envelopes – New boxes of Offertory Envelopes are now available and can be picked up from the back of the Church. Many thanks to those who distributed those boxes in previous years. However, this year parishioners are asked to pick up their own envelopes (and perhaps those of their neighbour) from the Church. While the present corona virus pandemic continues, our regular distributers (many of whom have been cocooning) are not expected to undertake this task again this year

Bishop elect Fr. Paul Dempsey - will be ordained Bishop on Sunday, August 30th in the cathedral in Ballaghaderreen.

Straide Church Reopening – From June 29th Churches will be able to reopen for public Masses again. The experience of attending Mass will be a little different from what people were used to previously. Many protocols will have to be introduced in order to guarantee the safety and well-being of those attending. The safety of Mass goers is a priority. Please note the following:

- * In order to facilitate Social Distancing, the Church will now have ONLY 14 pews available for seating.
- * These 14 pews can accommodate either (i) 14 families or (ii) 28 individuals (from different households) or (iii) 28 couples (from different households) or (iv) any combination of these three possibilities provided the total number does not exceed 50.
- * It is anticipated that there will not be a problem accommodating the numbers attending daily Masses. However, this may not be true for weekend Masses.
- * For some parishes, rather than having to choose 50 parishioners to be admitted, they have decided that they will not reopen until the end of July when it is expected that 100 people can attend Mass.
- * Here in Straide it has been decided to reopen for both daily and weekend Masses, while still observing social distancing and all HSE guidelines and government rules.
- * Thus, we must plan attendance at weekend Masses very carefully and in advance.
- * It is important that those who intend to be present at either Saturday evening or Sunday morning Masses should decide, in advance, during the week which Mass they will attend.
- * From midday on Sunday 28th, 50 admission tickets for the following Saturday evening Mass (July 4th), as well as 50 different admission tickets for Sunday morning Mass (July 5th) will be available from the back of the Church.
- * Parishioners can, throughout the week, pick up these tickets on a first come basis. Tickets can not be "reserved" for individuals.
- * One ticket is needed for each *person* i.e. one ticket for a single individual, two tickets for a couple and as required for a family.
- * Those who turn up without the appropriate ticket for that Mass are unlikely to gain admission if the quota of 50 is reached, but may wait in the car park where Holy Communion will be brought after Mass.
- * Please remember that the Church Obligation to attend Mass at the weekend does not apply during this pandemic.
- * For two days of the week, the daily Mass will be in the evening at 7.00 pm for those who may prefer to attend Mass with fewer people present than at the weekend.
- * Our arrangements are put in place to facilitate our *regular* Mass goers. Unfortunately, it will not be possible to facilitate people from other parishes who would not normally attend Masses in Straide.
- * The Church will be sanitised after each daily Mass and will be deep cleaned before each weekend Mass.
- * Where possible, please leave a parking space free between each car in the car park.
- * Face coverings are recommended by the HSE and government but (as of yet) are not compulsory.
- * Sanitizers are provided in the Church and should be used on entry and on exit. However, it is also recommended that parishioners carry a small hand sanitizer on their person as well.

Offertory Envelopes - can be returned when Masses re-open to the public again or when your own finances allow. Sincere thanks to those who have already made returns. As previously stated, there is no pressure to do so at this time.

RETURN TO THE PUBLIC CELEBRATION OF MASS AND THE SACRAMENTS: As we look forward in joy and hope to the re-opening of our churches for the celebration of Mass and the Sacraments, we offer this framework document to the dioceses and parishes of Ireland (available to read at https://achonrydiocese.org/returntoworship). At the end of the month we hope to slowly and cautiously resume public worship in our churches, knowing that it can only happen in a limited way. We will still need patience, perseverance and self-sacrifice. The prescriptions contained in the Framework Document will only be effective if we have the generous support of volunteers who will help to plan, implement and manage the transition back to full parish life and the celebration of the sacraments.
