Level 5 Coronavirus Guidance for Churches

Under Level 5 restrictions all Masses are online. The church will be open, as usual, for private visits.

During this period, all Masses from the church will take place as usual, but without a congregation present.

Mass Intentions (Anniversaries etc): Those already booked will take place as originally scheduled unless the family wishes to postpone. Due to the uncertainty surrounding church reopening, it is not possible to offer a rescheduled date. All Masses are available to watch online at www.straideparish.com

Baptisms: These can go ahead with minimum numbers (the baby, parents, godparents, and celebrant).

Weddings: are allowed with numbers limited to 6 people.

Funerals are limited to 10 people.

Please Keep Safe in the church: Use sanitizer gel; wear face covering and keep a safe distance from one another.

COVID-19 Support Line for Older People - ALONE manage a national support line and additional supports for older people who have concerns or are facing difficulties relating to COVID-19 (Coronavirus).
