The household returns and ancillary records for the censuses of Ireland of 1901 and 1911. All thirty-two counties for 1901 and 1911, are now searchable

Griffith's Valuation of Ireland 1848 – 1864

Is a (*free, online searchable database*), also known as Primary Valuation of Ireland, a property tax survey carried out in the mid-nineteenth century under the supervision of Sir Richard Griffith.

It was the detailed valuation of every taxable piece of agricultural / built property on the island of Ireland and was published county-by-county.

This can be used as a census substitute for the years after the Great Famine, as very little census data prior to 1901 has survived.

The "AskAboutIreland" collection is an initiative of the Irish public libraries.

It can be searched by surname or placename.

Tithe Applotment Books 1823-1837

The books were compiled between 1823 and 1827

Tithes were a tax levied on agricultural land by the Church of Ireland, and provide a record of land occupiers with more than one acre and record the name of only the head of the household.

In 1855, Castle Garden became America's first immigrant receiving center, with more than 8 million immigrants coming in, before it was closed in 1890. Castle Garden was succeeded by Ellis Island in 1892.

Ellis Island, (*online searchable database*) in Upper New York Bay, was a gateway for millions of immigrants to the USA from 1892 until 1924. It was previously known as Castle Gardens.

The first immigrant to pass through Ellis Island was Annie Moore, a 15-year-old girl from Cork, Ireland, who arrived on the ship *Nevada* on January 1, 1892
